MORE THAN 775 CANDIDATES REGISTER FOR IICL EXAMINATIONS

Washington, D.C. – The Institute of International Container Lessors (IICL) has announced that more than 775 candidates have signed up to date for the September 24, 2011, IICL Inspector's Examinations. With the deadline for late registrations approaching on September 5, 2011, IICL continues to receive applications and inquiries from candidates all over the world.

These exams test the knowledge of an individual's ability to understand and interpret inspection and repair criteria for use in a wide range of practical applications throughout our industry. Candidates who pass the examinations will be awarded IICL certificates, photo identification cards and will have their names listed in the IICL Online Inspection Directory for a five year period.

The 2011 Container examination is based on the Full Set of Container Inspection Publications (six manuals), the Convention for Safe Container pamphlet, and IICL Technical Bulletin 002: Electronic Data Interchange Standards (EDIS). The Guide for Chassis Inspection & Maintenance, 4th edition is the only manual required to study for the chassis examination.

The Full Set of Container Publications is Product code 1198, the Chassis Inspection & Maintenance Guide is Product code 2105. Both the container and chassis manuals can be ordered via the IICL online store by logging into <http://www.iicl.org/store/storeform.cfm>
